CLEVELAND, Ohio — CompetitiveReady founding partner, Don Schjeldahl, will leave the Austin Company on

March 1 to take a position with Sierra Nevada Brewing Co. of Chico, California.

region's long tradition for community sustainability and environmental programs, tenets important to Sierra Nevada.

Schjeldahl leaves The Austin Company as vice president of renewable energy strategies, where he led company

efforts to develop new markets around the new energy economy, including the manufacturing and deployment of
